5 Requesting a study of the employment
6 of Alaskan natives.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the employment of Alaskan natives is of vital concern to the
9 state; and

10 WHEREAS, despite this concern, the employment of Alaskan natives remains
11 too low, due to various sociological and educational factors, as well as
12 administrative regulations, personnel rules, and statutes which impose un-
13 realistic requirements or otherwise deter full employment;

14 BE IT RESOLVED that the governor is requested to direct the Commission
15 for Human Rights to conduct a study of the state's practices, procedures
16 and law relating to the hiring of Alaskan natives, the study to include
17 consideration of available training programs and the efforts, if any, that
18 are being made to increase the employability of Alaskan natives; and be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission shall also determine what adminis-
20 trative regulations, personnel rules, and statutes may be unrealistic or
21 otherwise deter full employment, and shall make a report to the Second
22 Session of the Sixth State Legislature, which report shall include recom-
23 mendations for changes in the regulations, rules and statutes, if changes
24 are found to be desirable in order to increase this employability.
