SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

SIXTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

Relating to educational television in
remote villages.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS educational television has the potential for providing most
remote villages with timely and relevant programming of the quality received
by larger communities; and

WHEREAS the Columbia Broadcasting System has recently developed a
seamingly simple and inexpensive means of providing both educational and
entertainment closed-circuit television called "Electronic Video Recording"
(E.V.R.); and

WHEREAS adoption of this system by the state would appear to be one
effective means of greatly enhancing the educational standards and
materials of the smaller and more remote villages;

BE IT RESOLVED that the governor is respectfully requested to direct
the Department of Education, in conjunction with other appropriate state
agencies, to investigate the feasibility and probable costs of installing
the E.V.R. system as an educational tool in those communities having no
television reception capabilities and of establishing a central E.V.R.
"mailing library" program under the auspices of the Department of Education.
