2 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 17

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SIXTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to the Department of Public  
6 Works' application to the FCC request-  
7 ing the assignment of a common  
8 frequency for emergency use purposes,  
9 to Alaska.

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 WHEREAS Alaska includes within its great land mass many remote villages  
12 and camps which are totally dependent upon radio; and

13 WHEREAS the rapid acceleration of activity in these remote areas during  
14 the past year has emphasized the lack of adequate communication in the state  
15 beyond the relatively few major centers of population; and

16 WHEREAS, with the exception of one or two radio schedules per working  
17 day, many construction camps, field crews and even sizable villages have no  
18 contact with the rest of the world; and

19 WHEREAS the frequent need for immediate medical aid or emergency  
20 transportation is common to all isolated communities and villages; and

21 WHEREAS presently there is no predictable way to summon aid since there  
22 is no emergency frequency common to the many existing radio stations that  
23 are licensed to individuals, companies and governmental agencies;

24 BE IT RESOLVED that the Sixth Alaska State Legislature respectfully  
25 requests that the FCC approve Alaska's application for the assignment of a  
26 common emergency land frequency and the establishment of an integrated emer-  
27 gency radio network for stations in Alaska.
