6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the careless use of firearms  
7 while hunting."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 11.15.200(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) A person who intentionally, and without malice, points or  
11 aims a firearm at or toward a person, or discharges a firearm so  
12 pointed or aimed at a person, or points and discharges a firearm at  
13 or toward a person or object without knowing the identity of the  
14 object and maims or injures a human being, is guilty of the careless  
15 use of firearms, and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not  
16 more than \$1,000, or imprisonment for not more than one year, or by  
17 both. If an offense committed by a person under this section was  
18 committed while hunting, upon conviction, the court shall, in addition  
19 to the penalty imposed in this section, revoke the person's hunting  
20 license. A person whose license has been revoked may not purchase  
21 another license of the same type for a period of not less than one  
22 year nor more than 10 years from the date of revocation as determined  
23 by the court.

24 \* Sec. 2. AS 11.15.200 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

25 (d) A person who knows of a violation under this section and  
26 fails to report it within a reasonable time to a peace officer in the  
27 state, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000,  
28 or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both.
