6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to eligibility for teachers retire-  
7 ment; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 14.25.110(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) A teacher who has completed either (1) 15 years of creditable  
11 service, the last five years of which have been membership service in  
12 the state, and has completed a total of at least eight years of member-  
13 ship service in the state, and who has attained the age of 55 years,  
14 or (2) 30 years of creditable service, the last five years of which  
15 have been membership service in the state, may retire from service, and  
16 apply in writing to the administrator for retirement salary. A retired  
17 teacher who has been receiving a disability retirement salary shall be  
18 eligible for a service retirement salary upon or after attaining age 60.

19 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.25.110(b) is amended to read:

20 (b) A teacher who has completed 15 years of creditable service,  
21 the last five years of which have been membership service in the state,  
22 and has completed a total of at least eight years of membership service  
23 in the state, and who has attained the age of 65 years during a school  
24 year, shall be retired on July 1 following his 65th birthday unless the  
25 teacher is retained by request of his employer. Provisions of this sub-  
26 section regarding compulsory retirement shall not apply to personnel of  
27 the University of Alaska.

28 \* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1972.
