7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS currently and during the past week the Department of the Interior
9 has held hearings in Anchorage regarding the environmental impact report on
10 the proposed trans-Alaska pipeline; and

11 WHEREAS, because of the great numbers of persons desiring to testify,
12 the hearing panel has graciously agreed to remain in session until all
13 witnesses can be heard; and

14 WHEREAS the hearings have and are being conducted in a most objective
15 and impartial manner; and

16 WHEREAS the Anchorage hearings have afforded Alaskans of every walk of
17 life and every persuasion the opportunity of being heard on the pipeline
18 issue;

19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that it commends the
20 hearing panel of the Department of the Interior for holding the current
21 hearings in Alaska and extends its most sincere thanks to the Secretary of
22 of the Interior for having men the caliber of Jack O. Horton, Robert Mesch
23 and Burton Silcock conduct the hearings.
