2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 62

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SEVENTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to the need for increased
6 Coast Guard personnel and equipment
7 at Kodiak.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS it is of vital importance that sufficient personnel and equip-
10 ment be utilized in Alaska for the full protection of our fishery resources;
11 and

12 WHEREAS the United States Coast Guard is charged with the patrol and
13 surveillance of our waters in order to prohibit foreign fishing vessels
14 from encroachment; and

15 WHEREAS the territory that must be covered by relatively few Coast
16 Guard ships and personnel is so vast that the task presently imposes an
17 unrealistic burden on the Coast Guard; and

18 WHEREAS only recently, nine foreign vessels were discovered in a
19 closed area north of Unimak Island; and

20 WHEREAS one of the most important of all Coast Guard facilities is
21 located at Kodiak from which thousands of miles of our waters must be
22 constantly patrolled;

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Seventh State Legislature that the United States
24 Coast Guard is urgently requested to provide additional equipment and
25 personnel to the Coast Guard facility at Kodiak; and be it

26 FURTHER RESOLVED that the additional equipment be at a minimum, composed
27 of an additional cutter of the CONFIDENCE class, long endurance type heli-
28 copters (H 3 type), and electronic surveillance equipped aircraft capable
29 of performing in inclement weather and at night.

3 dant, U. S. Coast Guard; Rear Admiral R. E. Hammond, Commander, 17th Coast

5 Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Nick Begich, U. S. Representative,
6 members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
