2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 74

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SEVENTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to the proposed new pattern
6 of air services for Alaska.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS a Civil Aeronautics Board examiner has recently recommended
9 drastic changes in the pattern of air services for Alaska; and

10 WHEREAS, if adopted by the board, Pan American, the pioneer carrier in
11 service to Alaska, would lose all rights to operate in Alaska, and Western
12 Airlines would be removed from all except a Seattle-Anchorage-Honolulu route;
13 and

14 WHEREAS the net result of these recommendations would be to completely
15 eliminate any competitive air service operations in Southeast Alaska and
16 also adversely effect the level of service to Fairbanks now provided by Pan
17 American; and

18 WHEREAS the Civil Aeronautics Board has ordered a review of these
19 recommendations made by its hearing examiner; and

20 WHEREAS there appears to be no overriding logic attached to the
21 examiners recommendations and it is generally a fact that the result of
22 competition is improved service at more reasonable rates;

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that it strongly opposes the
24 recommendations embodied in the Civil Aeronautics Board examiners report and
25 urgently requests the Governor to take all appropriate and immediate action
26 to appeal to the Civil Aeronautics Board the decision of the examiner as not
27 being in the best interests of Alaska; and be it

28 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Civil Aeronautics Board is urgently requested
29 to reject the recommendations of its hearing examiner and to not approve any

1 air transportation policy that would create a monopoly for any one air
2 carrier in any area of the state, or that would reduce service to any area
3 of the state to a lower level than it currently receives.

4 COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Secor D. Browne,
5 Chairman Civil Aeronautics Board; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the
6 Honorable Mike Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Nick Begich, U. S.
7 Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
