2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 100

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SEVENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Supporting S. 955.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

7 WHEREAS S. 955 currently pending before the United States Congress
8 would authorize the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Wel-
9 fare to permit the utilization of Indian Health Service facilities by non-
10 Indians under certain circumstances; and

11 WHEREAS non-Native rural residents of Alaska currently must travel great
12 distances and at great expense to obtain even the most routine health care;
13 and

14 WHEREAS many more badly needed private physicians, dentists and ancil-
15 lary health professionals could be attracted to rural Alaska if existing
16 Indian Health Service facilities were available for their practices; and

17 WHEREAS, at times, existing health facilities in rural Alaska are not
18 utilized to the fullest extent possible because of the existing regulations
19 regarding those facilities; and

20 WHEREAS all Alaskans should have the same rights and privileges regard-
21 ing access to available medical and dental services; and

22 WHEREAS duplication and fragmentation of services and facilities in
23 small communities is not only a financially ruinous proposition, but, to a
24 large degree, results in inferior health care being offered by either system;

25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that the United States Congress
26 is urged to make passage of S. 955 a priority matter during this session of
27 Congress so that all Alaskans residing in rural Alaska may enjoy the best
28 health care available to them.
