Requesting the immediate cessation

6

of new route construction in the

7

Blair Lakes area and the issuance of

8

an environmental impact statement

9

on all further improvements to the

10

Blair Lakes bombing range.

11

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

12

WHEREAS of major concern to all Alaskans is the perpetuation of fish

13

and game and the protection of its habitat; and

14

WHEREAS the Blair Lakes bombing and gunnery range, established in 1941,

15

is a vast land and water area stretching from Wood River in the west to

16

Little Delta in the east; and

17

WHEREAS, since its establishment, bombing activities and other operations

18

within the confines of the range have caused almost annual forest fires,

19

resulting in senseless destruction in this great natural area with attendant

20

severe air pollution; and

21

WHEREAS, along with other accidents, aircraft bombing operations have

22

caused the City of Fairbanks to be showered with no less than 19 live rockets;

23

and

WHEREAS presently new routing construction is being undertaken in the

25

range, largely unnoticed by the public, which is following the historical

26

Bonnefield Trail and destroying additional valuable land, in distance approxi-

27

mately one-tenth the length of the proposed trans-Alaska pipeline;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Seventh Alaska State Legislature requests the

29

immediate cessation of the Bonnefield Trail road construction route to

1 the Blair Lakes bombing range; and be it

2 FURTHER RESOLVED that any future improvements or access in the range be
3 preceded by comprehensive environmental impact statements, including but
4 not limited to, consideration of alternate sites in more remote areas in
5 Alaska or Canada by contract or treaty.

11 Gravel, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Nick Begich, U.S. Representative,
12 members of the Alaska delegation in Congress; the Honorable William A. Egan,
13 Governor of Alaska; and the Honorable Charles F. Herbert, Commissioner,
14 Alaska Department of Natural Resources.
