6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to advisory school boards."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 14.14.170 is amended by adding new subsections to read:

9 (c) In communities qualifying for three-member advisory school
10 boards under (a) of this section, voters qualified under sec. 180 of
11 this chapter may increase the board to five members by referendum
12 conducted at an election coinciding with an election for advisory
13 school board members. In communities qualifying for five-member
14 advisory school boards under (a) of this section, voters qualified
15 under sec. 180 of this chapter may increase the board to seven members
16 by referendum conducted at an election coinciding with an election for
17 advisory school board members.

18 (d) The date of election for advisory school board members is
19 the same as that for regular municipal elections in the fourth class
20 city having the largest population in the area served by the board or,
21 if there is no fourth class city within the area, on an annual election
22 date for such elections fixed by regulation of the board of directors
23 for state-operated schools.

24 (e) Elections under (c) and (d) of this section shall be conducted
25 upon such notice and otherwise substantially in the same manner as
26 regular municipal elections which are held within the largest fourth
27 class city in the area served by the board. If there is no fourth
28 class city within the area, elections shall be conducted upon at least
29 10 days published or posted public notice of the election and of the

1 question or nominees to be voted on and under general rules for the
2 elections as may be promulgated by regulation of the board of directors
3 for state-operated schools. Elections relating to advisory school
4 boards shall be supervised by the director of state-operated schools
5 but shall be administered within fourth class cities as part of the
6 regular municipal election.

7 * Sec. 2. AS 14.14.190(c) is amended to read:

8 (c) If a three-member advisory school board is increased to a
9 five-member advisory school board [BECAUSE OF INCREASED ENROLLMENT],
10 the two additional members are elected for terms of two years and
11 three years respectively. Thereafter, all members are elected to
12 three-year terms. If a five-member advisory school board is increased
13 to a seven-member advisory school board, the two additional members
14 are elected for terms of two years and three years respectively.
15 Thereafter, all members are elected to three-year terms and until a
16 successor takes office.
