6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to state parks; and providing for an
7 effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 *Section 1. AS 41.20 is amended by adding new sections to read:

10 Sec. 41.20.261. DESIGNATED STATE LAND AND WATER RESTRICTED TO USE
11 AS A STATE PARK FOR WILDERNESS PURPOSES. (a) The presently state-owned
12 lands and waters, and all those acquired in the future by the state,
13 lying within the parcels described in this section are designated as the
14 Kachemak Bay State Wilderness Park. In order to protect and preserve
15 these lands and waters for their unique and exceptional wilderness value,
16 the park is established and shall be managed as a wilderness park. The
17 lands and waters lying within the following described parcels are re-
18 served from all uses incompatible with their primary function as a
19 wilderness park and are assigned to the Department of Natural Resources
20 for control, development and maintenance:

20 (b) The following public domain lands shall be selected by the
21 state, and classified as wilderness park lands and designated as part
22 of Kachemak Bay State Park immediately upon receipt of management

1 (c) Lands lying within the parcels described in (a) and (b) of
2 this section, upon which there are valid entries or upon which there
3 are valid applications for leases filed under AS 38.05 before May 9,
4 1971 are excepted from (a) and (b) of this section; however, if any
5 lands excepted under this subsection are subsequently relinquished to
6 the state, they shall be included as part of Kachemak Bay State Wilder-
7 ness Park.

8 Sec. 41.20.450. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter

9 (1) "scenic park" means relatively spacious areas of out-
10 standing natural significance, where major values are in their natural
11 geological, faunal or floral characteristics, the purpose of which is
12 directed primarily toward the preservation of its outstanding natural
13 features and where development is minimal and only for the purpose of
14 making the areas available for public enjoyment in a manner consistent
15 with the preservation of the natural values such as camping, picnicking,
16 sightseeing, nature study, hiking, riding and related activities which
17 involve no major modification of the lands, forests or waters, and
18 without extensive introduction of artificial features or forms of
19 recreational development that are primarily of urban characters;

20 (2) "wilderness park" means an area whose predominant
21 character is the result of the interplay of natural processes, large
22 enough and so situated as to be unaffected, except in minor ways, by
23 what takes place in the nonwilderness around it, a physical condition
24 which activates the innermost emotions of the observer and where
25 development of man-made objects will be strictly limited and depend
26 entirely on good taste and judgment so that the wilderness values are
27 not lost.

28 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the date after its passage and approval
29 or on the day it becomes law without approval.
