6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the sale of state lands."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 38.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

9 Sec. 38.05.064. PREFERENCE TO RESIDENTS. (a) The director,
10 with the concurrence of the commissioner, when it is determined that
11 it would be in the best interests of the state, may offer unoccupied
12 or unappropriated state land at a restricted sale at which only resi-
13 dents of the state may buy, or he may grant a resident a 60-day first
14 option from the date the land becomes available to the public or 90
15 days from the effective date of this section, whichever is later, to
16 purchase unoccupied or unappropriated state land.

17 (b) The director may not sell the lands under this section at
18 less than their fair appraised market value. When not in conflict
19 with this section, other provisions of secs. 45 - 69 of this chapter
20 apply to sales under this section. Before the notice of a sale of
21 land under secs. 45 - 69 of this chapter, the director shall establish
22 the precedence or priority of preferences that may be applied to sales
23 under secs. 45 - 69 of this chapter so that as between two or more
24 equally qualified persons for a parcel of land, the person who qualifies
25 for, or accumulates, the greater number of preferences established under
26 secs. 66 - 69 of this chapter, shall be declared the successful bidder.
27 If two or more equally qualified persons qualify for, or accumulate,
28 the same number of preferences established under secs. 66 - 69 of this
29 chapter, the director may determine priority by lot. The precedence

1 or priority of preferences shall be published in the notice of sale.

2 (c) For the purpose of secs. 45 - 69 of this chapter "resident"
3 means

4 (1) a person who for 12 consecutive months preceding the
5 sale has maintained a permanent place of abode in the state and who
6 has continually maintained his voting residence in the state;

7 (2) in the case of a partnership, association, joint stock
8 company, trust, or corporation, one that has its main office or
9 headquarters in the state;

10 (3) a governmental unit, including, without limitation,
11 municipalities or boroughs;

12 (4) a member of the military service who has been stationed
13 in the state for 12 consecutive months preceding the sale and who is
14 a registered voter in the state and a dependent of a resident member
15 of the military service who has been living in the state for the same
16 period;

17 (5) a person who is an alien but who for three years pre-
18 ceding the sale has maintained a permanent place of abode in the
19 state and who has declared his intention of becoming a citizen of
20 the United States.
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
