5 Honoring Louis J. Glatz.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

7 WHEREAS Louis J. Glatz, one of Alaska's premier citizens passed away  
8 suddenly on December 22, 1970; and

9 WHEREAS, since his arrival in Alaska in 1922, Mr. Glatz continuously  
10 and unselfishly served the State of Alaska and its people in many capacities;  
11 and

12 WHEREAS his many activities and posts included supervision of the in-  
13 stallation of most of the aids to navigation in Southeastern Alaska, service  
14 as Commanding Officer of the cutters Cedar, Sweetbriar and Hemlock, service  
15 as the mayor of the Gateway City, service as a charter member and former  
16 president of the Tongass Historical Society, active participation in the  
17 Masons and Pioneers of Alaska; and

18 WHEREAS Commander Glatz was known from the Bering Sea to Puget Sound  
19 and was noted for his humorous accounts of his experiences and his witty  
20 comments and observations concerning many facets of life;

21 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature expresses its sincere  
22 sorrow at the loss to Alaska of Louis J. Glatz and conveys the most heartfelt  
23 condolences to his wife Connie, and other members of his family.
