7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the United States Department of the Interior is holding hearings
9 in Anchorage, February 24 and 25 on the environmental impact of the proposed
10 North Slope pipeline; and

11 WHEREAS the Legislature wishes to express its appreciation to the
12 Department of the Interior for conducting these hearings in Alaska, thereby
13 presenting Alaskans the opportunity to be heard on this subject vital to the
14 future of the state; and

15 WHEREAS the Legislature desires to have the State of Alaska participate
16 to the maximum extent in the proper and timely resolution of this important
17 question; and

18 WHEREAS, because of the importance of this hearing, both Houses of
19 the Legislature have recessed to allow their members to attend this hearing;

20 BE IT RESOLVED that the First Session of the Seventh State Legislature
21 commends the Department of the Interior for the hearings held in Alaska and
22 welcomes the many federal officials to our great state; and be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED that, because the Legislature as well as all other
24 Alaskans desires to have the pipeline issue resolved at the earliest possible
25 time, officials of the Department of the Interior are respectfully requested
26 to inform the Alaska State Legislature and the Governor if there are any
27 steps or action of any kind that may be taken by the state to bring the
28 pipeline issue to a proper, yet timely, resolution.
