2 SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 20

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SEVENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Relating to a study of no-fault
6 automobile insurance.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS there is widespread dissatisfaction being expressed throughout
9 the country concerning the traditional automobile insurance plans which
10 essentially require a person to prove "fault" before he is reimbursed for
11 damages and injuries suffered in automobile accidents; and

12 WHEREAS no-fault insurance plans have been enacted in six states and
13 are under consideration by numerous others, including Alaska; and

14 WHEREAS the six states that have enacted no-fault insurance plans all
15 have adopted differing and dissimilar plans to greater or lesser degrees; and

16 WHEREAS automobile insurance that protects to the greatest degree all of
17 our citizens from loss and in the most equitable manner possible is desirable;
18 and

19 WHEREAS there has not been a thorough study made in Alaska of the
20 advantages and disadvantages of the various no-fault plans that are the sub-
21 ject of discussion around the country; and

22 WHEREAS all of the legal, moral and social implications of no-fault
23 insurance and the many versions thereof ought to be thoroughly examined before
24 adoption or rejection of any particular plan by the Alaska Legislature;

25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that the Legislative Council is
26 directed to conduct an interim study of the various no-fault automobile
27 insurance plans that have been proposed and enacted in the various states; and
28 be it

29 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council make its report, together

1 with its recommendations for adoption or rejection of no-fault automobile
2 insurance for Alaska, the recommendations to include draft legislation for
3 the legislature's consideration if a change from the present "fault" prin-
4 ciple is thought desirable, to the First Session of the Eighth Legislature.
