2 *CS* SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 57

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SEVENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Opposing S. 2815.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

7 WHEREAS the Congress of the United States presently is considering
8 S. 2815, by Senator Hart of Michigan and Senator Harris of Oklahoma, that
9 would require all citizens to surrender handguns to the federal government
10 within 180 days of the passage of the measure, except for law officers,
11 licensed security guards or members of licensed gun clubs with locked
12 storage places using the guns for bona fide target, sport shooting or other
13 legitimate recreational purposes; and

14 WHEREAS those turning in the handguns would receive in return whatever
15 the federal government adjudged the "fair market value" of the weapon, and
16 the penalty for failure to surrender the handgun would be as much as a
17 \$5,000 fine and five years in federal prison; and

18 WHEREAS the prohibition of the act also would extend to handgun ammuni-
19 tion; and

20 WHEREAS the legislation further would "prohibit the importation,
21 manufacture, sale, purchase, transfer, receipt, possession, or transportation
22 of handguns except for or by members of the armed forces, law enforcement
23 officials and, as authorized by the Secretary of the Treasury, licensed
24 importers, manufacturers, dealers, antique collectors and pistol clubs"; and

25 WHEREAS in the judgment of the Alaska Legislature this legislation
26 violates the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States which
27 protects a citizen's right to keep and bear arms for his own protection or
28 for legitimate recreational use;

29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that it opposes the enactment
