5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating the Board of Automobile Mechanic
7 Examiners."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 08 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

10 CHAPTER 61. BOARD OF MECHANIC EXAMINERS.

11 Sec. 08.61.010. CREATION AND MEMBERSHIP OF BOARD. There is
12 created the Board of Automobile Mechanic Examiners, consisting of five
13 members appointed by the governor.

14 Sec. 08.61.020. TERM OF OFFICE. Board members serve a term of
15 five years. However, of the members first appointed, one shall be
16 appointed for a term of one year, one for two years, one for three
17 years, one for four years, and one for five years.

18 Sec. 08.61.030. QUALIFICATIONS OF BOARD MEMBERS. Each member of
19 the board shall be a resident of the state with at least five years of
20 experience as an automobile mechanic, the last two of which must have
21 been as the chief mechanic in a reputable automobile shop or an auto-
22 mobile mechanic instructor in a recognized vocational school.

23 Sec. 08.61.040. REMOVAL FROM OFFICE. Each member of the board
24 holds office at the pleasure of the governor.

25 Sec. 08.61.050. MEETINGS. The board shall meet at least once a
26 year.

27 Sec. 08.61.060. QUORUM. A majority of the board constitutes a
28 quorum for the conducting of business.

29 Sec. 08.61.070. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD. The board shall

1 (1) promulgate regulations concerning examination and licens-
2 ing of automobile mechanics;

3 (2) provide for an apprenticeship program in automobile
4 mechanics so that a licensed mechanic has no more than three unlicensed
5 apprentices in his charge at any one time and so that no unlicensed
6 mechanic is without direct supervision of a licensed mechanic;

7 (3) establish examination and licensing fees in order to
8 cover all expenses of administering this chapter;

9 (4) keep a record of all proceedings, and submit an annual
10 report to the governor and the legislature.

11 Sec. 08.61.080. ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES. The Department of
12 Commerce shall provide administrative services to the board as it may
13 require.

14 Sec. 08.61.090. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT. The board shall
15 comply with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62).

16 Sec. 08.61.100. COMPENSATION. The board members serve without
17 compensation but are entitled to per diem and travel expenses as pro-
18 vided by law.
