6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to architecture, engineering and land  
7 surveying; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 08.48.011(b) is amended to read:

10 (b) The board consists of 10 [NINE] members appointed by the  
11 governor having the qualifications as set out in sec. 31 of this  
12 chapter. The board consists of two civil engineers, one land surveyor,  
13 one mining engineer, one petroleum engineer, two engineers from other  
14 branches of the profession of engineering, and three architects. All  
15 members of the board shall be registered in the discipline which they  
16 are appointed to represent. At least six members of the board shall be  
17 registered engineers.

18 \* Sec. 2. AS 08.48.021(b) is amended to read:

19 (b) The term of office for board members is six years. The first  
20 board shall be appointed with two members having two-year terms, two  
21 members having three-year terms, two members having four-year terms,  
22 two members [ONE MEMBER] having five-year terms [A FIVE-YEAR TERM] and  
23 two members having six-year terms. A member of the board may be  
24 appointed to succeed himself. Each member shall hold office until the  
25 expiration of the term for which he is appointed or until his successor  
26 has been appointed. If a vacancy occurs on the board due to resignation,  
27 death or other cause, the governor shall appoint a qualified person to  
28 serve the unexpired term.

1           Sec. 08.48.031. QUALIFICATIONS. A member [EACH MEMBER] of the  
2 board shall be registered in his respective discipline for at least  
3 five years and must have been a resident in the state for three con-  
4 secutive years immediately preceding his appointment.

5 \* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect July 1, 1973.
