6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to designated use of trails and paths."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 41.20.355(c) is amended to read:

9 (c) Before a grant is awarded under this section, application shall
10 be submitted to the commissioner of natural resources, accompanied by a
11 comprehensive plan for the establishment of trails and paths [FOOTPATHS].
12 The plan may provide for ski trails, dog sled trails, motorized vehicle
13 trails, bicycle paths, bridle paths, footpaths and other trails and
14 paths, and designate separate and incompatible uses of these trails and
15 paths.

16 * Sec. 2. AS 41.20.360 is amended to read:

17 Sec. 41.20.360. PATHS [FOOTPATHS] AND TRAILS ALONG HIGHWAYS. The
18 commissioner of highways shall administer the plan and program providing
19 for the establishment and maintenance of footpaths, bridle paths,
20 bicycle paths, ski trails, dog sled trails, motorized vehicle trails
21 and other paths and trails along certain designated existing highways,
22 or when a highway, road or street is being constructed, reconstructed or
23 relocated after June 7, 1972. Trails established under an approved plan
24 submitted by the Department of Highways may be used for those types of
25 uses written into the plan and no other [MORE THAN ONE TYPE OF TRANS-
26 PORTATION, MOTORIZED OR NONMOTORIZED, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSIONER
27 OF HIGHWAYS]. A uniform system of marking of paths [FOOTPATHS] and
28 trails established under this section shall be established by the
29 commissioner of highways.
