6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Department of Labor; and
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.05.060 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 23.05.060. POWERS OF THE DEPARTMENT. The department may

11 (1) enforce all state labor laws;

12 (2) act as mediator and appoint deputy commissioners of
13 conciliation in labor disputes whenever it considers the interest of
14 industrial peace requires it;

15 (3) make investigations, collect and compile statistical
16 information concerning the conditions of labor generally and upon all
17 matters relating to the enforcement of this chapter;

18 (4) institute court proceedings against an employer of
19 labor without cost to the employee when it is satisfied that the
20 employer has failed to pay an employee an amount due by contract;

21 (5) issue cease and desist orders and other orders,
22 rules and regulations necessary for the enforcement of state labor
23 laws [TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS CHAPTER;

24 (6) ADMINISTER AND PROMULGATE REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO
25 CARRY OUT AS 18.60.705 - 18.60.740].

26 * Sec. 2. AS 23.05.080 is amended to read:

27 Sec. 23.05.080. EMPLOYER'S RECORDS. An employer shall keep
28 an accurate record of the name, address and occupation of each
29 person employed by him, of the daily and weekly hours worked by

1 each person, and of the wages paid each pay period to each person.

2 The record shall be kept on file for at least three years [ONE YEAR]

3 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and
4 approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
