2 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 73

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 EIGHTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to space in the Capitol

6 Building.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the legislature has never had adequate space to operate in the
9 state capitol; and

10 WHEREAS over the years the legislature has been in the position of
11 having to utilize, each session, whatever available space may be obtained
12 near the Capitol and no permanent quarters have been found, nor is the
13 legislature programmed into the new state office building now under construc-
14 tion; and

15 WHEREAS the needs of the legislature cannot be met except by having
16 permanent quarters in which staff and legislators alike have an atmosphere
17 conducive to the conduct of their business; and

18 WHEREAS the new state office building as well as the new courtroom
19 facility planned for Juneau will both be completed and open to occupancy in
20 the next few years; and

21 WHEREAS, if the Capitol, with the exception of the Governor's offices,
22 were all legislative space, more adequate facilities for the legislature
23 could all be contained in one building;

24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature that the Governor is respectfully
25 requested to direct the Commissioner of Administration to effectuate the
26 removal of all executive branch offices in the Capitol, except the Governor's
27 offices, as soon as construction on the new state office building is
28 completed, and to effectuate the removal of all judicial offices from the
29 Capitol upon completion of the courthouse facility in Juneau; and be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED that all such vacated space shall be assigned to the
2 legislature to remain under its permanent control and direction.
