2 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 64

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 EIGHTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Relating to the transportation of  
6 supplies by the Alyeska Pipeline  
7 Service Company to Alaska.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS it has come to the attention of the legislature that the  
10 Alyeska Pipeline Service Company and its subcontractors have used, or intend  
11 to use, Seattle as the point of entry into Alaska for the vast quantities of  
12 supplies needed for construction of the trans-Alaska pipeline; and

13 WHEREAS in many cases it will not be necessary for either Alyeska or  
14 its subcontractors to use Seattle as a point of entry; and

15 WHEREAS the utilization of Seattle as the point of entry in all cases  
16 tends to place Alaskans in a non-competitive position; and

17 WHEREAS it would be to Alyeska's advantage, as well as beneficial to  
18 many Alaskans, to accept quotes to a point of delivery in Alaska;

19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that it respectfully  
20 requests the Alyeska Pipeline Service Company to accept quotes for the  
21 delivery of goods to points in Alaska where it is not necessary or advanta-  
22 geous to utilize Seattle as the point of entry and also that Alyeska instruct  
23 all of its subcontractors to adhere to the same non-discriminatory practice.
