5 Paying tribute to the memory of Robert
6 L. Thomas.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the death of Robert L. Thomas, Deputy Commissioner of Education,
9 in the midst of a legislative session where his counsel on matters of public
10 education policy and finance was much sought after and heavily relied on,
11 profoundly saddens his friends among the membership of the Alaska Legislature;
12 and

13 WHEREAS in the drafting and presentation of legislation, a process in
14 which Bob Thomas was so intimately involved on behalf of the Department of
15 Education during each legislative session, there was no more constructive
16 team from an executive department that was easier to work with than that led
17 by Bob Thomas; even in disagreement with a certain policy objective, invar-
18 iably assistance would be provided in the preparation of a needed bill or
19 resolution; and, ultimately, as credible negotiators, there was always a
20 possible compromise -- these sorely needed skills will be much missed in
21 the absence of Bob Thomas; and

22 WHEREAS, a native of Oregon, he earned his Bachelor's and Master's
23 degrees in mathematics and general studies at the University of Oregon, and
24 a second Master's degree in general science at Oregon State University, and
25 taught math, science and psychology in Lebanon High School, Lebanon, Oregon,
26 before coming to Alaska to accept a position with the Department of Education;
27 although he and his beloved wife, Doris, intended to stay but two years,
28 they have remained 13; and

29 WHEREAS Bob Thomas felt deeply about his community and country, serving

1 them loyally and well as a member of the Assembly of the City and Borough of
2 Juneau and as an officer in the Alaska National Guard, holding the rank of
3 Lieutenant Colonel;

4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that in expressing its
5 deep sorrow over the passing of a valued advisor and friend, the members of
6 the legislature note with particular pride the distinguished contribution
7 Robert L. Thomas has made in the creation, operation and administration of a
8 sound, forward-looking system of public education in Alaska; the Juneau-
9 Douglas community is among the most progressive of the cities of Alaska
10 because of his service to it, and Bob Thomas's loyal devotion to Alaska, to
11 Juneau, to his profession and to his family will be both long remembered
12 and not easily replaced.
