4 EIGHTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Relating to a study of the feasibility
6 of establishing a school of forestry
7 and mining by the University of Alaska

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA;

9 WHEREAS proper development of the timber and mining industries has been
10 and will remain of great importance for generations of yet unborn Alaskans;
11 and

12 WHEREAS there is a growing need for professional and other personnel in
13 Alaska who are trained in the intricacies of all facets of these two indus-
14 tries; and

15 WHEREAS, although the University of Alaska currently has a school of
16 mines, it is felt that expansion and development of instructional programs
17 related to the timber and mining industries might be better served by the
18 creation of a school of forestry and mining; and

19 WHEREAS communities such as Juneau and Ketchikan, together with other
20 areas of the state, would seem to be logical locations for such curricula to
21 be developed and offered;

22 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests
23 the University of Alaska immediately to undertake a study of the feasibility
24 of establishing a school of forestry and mining and the development of proper
25 programs and course offerings in these areas at appropriate locations in the
26 state; and be it

27 FURTHER RESOLVED that the University present its report, with recommenda-
28 tions, to the Ninth Legislature - First Session.
