BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS proper development of the timber industry has been and will remain of great importance for generations of yet unborn Alaskans; and

WHEREAS there is a growing need for professional and other personnel in Alaska who are trained in the intricacies of all facets of this industry;

WHEREAS the University of Alaska currently has a school of mines, it is felt that expansion and development of instructional programs related to the timber industry might be better served by the creation of a school of forestry; and

WHEREAS communities in Southeast Alaska, together with other areas of the state, would seem to be logical locations for such curricula to be developed and offered;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the University of Alaska immediately to undertake a study of the feasibility of establishing a school of forestry and the development of proper programs and course offerings in these areas at appropriate locations in the state; and be it
