5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to revenue sharing with local govern-
7 ments; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 43.18.010(a)(6) is amended to read:

10 (6) \$5 per capita to cities and boroughs providing any of
11 the following municipally financed and operated facilities or services:

12 [TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES OR SERVICES LIMITED TO MUNICIPALLY-OPERATED]
13 small boat harbors, ports, or airports; [OR TRANSIT SYSTEMS.]

14 * Sec. 2. AS 43.18.010(a) is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

15 (7) \$5 per capita to cities and boroughs providing mass
16 transit facilities or services, whether by a municipally owned, financed
17 and operated system or by contract.

18 * Sec. 3. AS 43.18.010(h) and (i) are repealed and re-enacted to read:

19 (h) During each fiscal year the state shall make payments as
20 follows:

21 (1) \$1,000 per hospital bed to an organized borough or a
22 city outside an organized borough in which a hospital is operated for
23 each hospital bed actually used for patient care, limited to the number
24 of beds provided for in the construction design of the hospital, or
25 \$50,000 per hospital as the local government may determine;

26 (2) \$1,000 per hospital bed to hospitals located outside any
27 organized municipality for each hospital bed actually used for patient
28 care, limited to the number of beds provided for in the construction
29 design of the hospital, or \$50,000 as the hospital may determine;

1 (3) \$1,000 per bed to an organized borough or city outside
2 an organized borough in which a health facility is operated for each
3 bed actually used for patient care, limited to the number of beds pro-
4 vided for in the construction design of the health facility, or \$8,000
5 per health facility as the local government may determine;

6 (4) \$1,000 per bed to each health facility located outside
7 a municipality for each bed actually used for patient care, limited to
8 the number of beds provided for in the construction design of the
9 health facility, or \$8,000 per health facility as the nonprofit corpora-
10 tion or other nonprofit group or association located in the community
11 and operating the health facility may determine;

12 (5) funds received by a local government, hospital, or non-
13 profit corporation or other nonprofit group or association located in
14 the community and operating a health facility under (1), (2), (3), or
15 (4) of this subsection shall be used for expenses of operation, mainte-
16 nance, or health services or facilities;

17 (6) before funds may be distributed under this subsection,
18 the commissioner of health and social services shall certify to the
19 distributing agency that

20 (A) the local governments, hospitals, or health facili-
21 ties located outside a city or organized borough are entitled in
22 all respects to receive aid under this subsection or (j) of this
23 section;

24 (B) the recipient local government, hospital, nonprofit
25 corporation or other nonprofit group or association located in a
26 community and operating a health facility has not incurred in the
27 prior year expenses for rent, supplies, services, or otherwise,
28 which exceed their fair market or reasonable value; and

29 (C) any accumulation of assets by nonprofit corporations

1 or other recipients under this subsection are dedicated irrevocably
2 to a public purpose;

3 (7) as a condition precedent to receipt of aid under this
4 subsection, a nonprofit corporation or other nonprofit group or associa-
5 tion located in and organized for the purpose of operating a health
6 facility in an unincorporated community must certify to the commissioner
7 of health and social services, at the time application is made, that the
8 corporation, group, or association is organized for the sole purpose
9 of operating a health facility, has established rules or bylaws to
10 regulate the conduct of the corporation, group, or association, and
11 that all meetings, proceedings and records of the group or corporation
12 are open to the public.

13 (i) In (h) and (j) of this section

14 (1) "hospital" means a licensed hospital determined by the
15 Department of Health and Social Services to be a general hospital; the
16 term excludes

17 (A) facilities operated or wholly supported by the
18 state or the federal government and

19 (B) nonprofit facilities leased from private profit-
20 making groups or corporations only as to use of shared revenue for
21 capital improvements under (j) of this section, but not as to use
22 of shared revenue for operating expenses under (h) of this section;

23 (2) "health facility" means public health centers, maternity
24 homes, and community mental health centers, facilities for the mentally
25 retarded or physically handicapped, nursing homes, convalescent centers
26 and facilities for the treatment and rehabilitation of alcoholism,
27 which are licensed, when required, by the state under AS 18.20.010 -
28 18.20.130 or AS 47.37.080 and are owned or operated or both by a local
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1 government or nonprofit corporation or other nonprofit sponsor; the
2 term excludes

3 (A) facilities wholly supported by the state or the
4 federal government and

5 (B) nonprofit facilities leased from private profit-
6 making groups or corporations only as to the use of shared revenue
7 for capital improvements under (j) of this section, but not as to
8 use of shared revenue for operating expenses under (h) of this
9 section.

10 * Sec. 4. AS 43.18.010 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

11 (k) In (a)(7) of this section "mass transit facilities or ser-
12 vices" means the transportation of groups of people over regular routes
13 at specified times in accordance with fixed and set tariffs but is
14 limited to transportation by rail, monorail or bus, specifically manu-
15 factured and designed to accommodate the general public.

16 * Sec. 5. AS 43.18 is amended by adding new sections to read:

17 Sec. 43.18.040. REGULATIONS. The Department of Community and
18 Regional Affairs shall promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the
19 purpose of this chapter.

20 Sec. 43.18.050. SPECIFIC EXPENDITURES. A municipality or a hos-
21 pital or health facility located outside a municipality shall expend
22 funds received for the operation and maintenance of hospitals and
23 health facilities and services and mass transit facilities and services
24 under this chapter only for those specific facilities and services.

25 * Sec. 6. This Act takes effect July 1, 1973.
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
