6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to schools on military reservations;
7 and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 14.12.020(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) Operation of the state-operated school district is under the
11 management and control of the board of the state-operated schools. The
12 board of the state-operated schools manages and controls schools on
13 military reservations located within a city or an organized borough
14 until the military mission [RESERVATION STATUS] is terminated and [,
15 THEREAFTER,] so long as management and control by the state-operated
16 schools is approved by the Department of Education. However, operation
17 of the military reservation schools by a city or borough school district
18 may be required by the Department of Education under AS 14.14.110,
19 with the consent of the city or borough school district board. If the
20 military mission of a military reservation terminates and continued
21 management and control by the state-operated schools is disapproved by
22 the Department of Education, operation, management and control of
23 schools on military reservations transfers to the city or borough school
24 district in which the military reservation is located.

25 * Sec. 2. AS 14.14.110 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

26 (b) The department may prescribe the terms and conditions of any
27 contract entered into under (a) of this section.

28 * Sec. 3. AS 14.14.170(a) is amended to read:

29 (a) There is established an advisory school board in each community

1 or military reservation served by a school [AND] operated by the state
2 or by a city or borough school district by contract with the state. If
3 the state-operated school has an average daily membership of less than
4 251 pupils, the advisory school board consists of three members. If the
5 average daily membership is more than 250 pupils, the advisory school
6 board consists of five members.

7 * Sec. 4. AS 14.14.170(b) is amended to read:

8 (b) Voters qualified under sec. 180 of this chapter, at an
9 election, may create an on-base advisory school board which shall be
10 advisory to the governing body of the school district that operates
11 the on-base schools. The date of election for on-base advisory school
12 board members, where the schools are operated by a city or borough
13 school district by contract, shall be the same as that for the regular
14 municipal election in the contracting city or borough.

15 * Sec. 5. AS 14.14.180(a)(4) is repealed.

16 * Sec. 6. AS 29.33.050 is amended to read:

17 Sec. 29.33.050. EDUCATION. Each borough constitutes a borough
18 school district and establishes, maintains, and operates a system of
19 public schools on an areawide basis as provided in AS 14.14.060. A
20 military reservation within an organized borough is not part of the
21 borough school district until the military mission [RESERVATION STATUS]
22 is terminated or [AND, THEREAFTER,] until inclusion in the borough
23 school district is approved by the Department of Education. However,
24 operation of the military reservation schools by the borough school
25 district may be required by the Department of Education under AS 14.14.-
26 110, with the consent of the borough school district board. If the
27 military mission of a military reservation terminates and continued
28 management and control by the state-operated schools is disapproved
29 by the Department of Education, operation, management and control of

1 schools on military reservations transfers to the borough school
2 district in which the military reservation is located.

3 * Sec. 7. AS 29.41.010(a) is amended to read:

4 (a) A third class borough shall exercise the areawide powers of
5 education and tax assessment and collection in the manner provided for
6 second class boroughs. Provisions of law relative to first and second
7 class organized boroughs apply with respect to third class boroughs
8 only to the extent they are consistent with this chapter. A military
9 reservation within an organized borough is not part of the borough
10 school district until the military mission [RESERVATION STATUS] is ter-
11 minated or [AND, THEREAFTER,] until inclusion in the borough school
12 district is approved by the Department of Education. However, opera-
13 tion of the military reservation schools by the borough school district
14 may be required by the Department of Education under AS 14.14.110, with
15 the consent of the borough school district board. If the military
16 mission of a military reservation terminates and continued management
17 and control by the state-operated schools is disapproved by the Depart-
18 ment of Education, operation, management and control of schools on
19 military reservations transfers to the borough school district in which
20 the military reservation is located.

21 * Sec. 8. AS 29.68.020 is amended to read:

22 Sec. 29.68.020. ANNEXATION OF MILITARY RESERVATIONS. A [NOTWITH-
23 STANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SEC. 3(d), CH. 52, SLA 1963, A] military
24 reservation may be annexed to a city or borough in the same manner as
25 prescribed for any other territory under sec. 10 of this chapter. If a
26 city within an organized borough annexes a military reservation under
27 this section, the territory encompassing the military reservation auto-
28 matically is annexed to the borough of which the city is a part.

29 * Sec. 9. The term of office of a member of the Board of Directors for

1 State-Operated Schools who is a resident of a military reservation whose
2 schools are operated by a city or borough school district in accordance with
3 a contract entered into under AS 14.14.110 by direction of the Department
4 of Education shall be terminated on the effective date of the contract.

5 * Sec. 10. When on-base schools are operated by a city or borough school
6 district by contract, the terms of office of those members of the on-base
7 advisory school board that would expire during the transitional period shall
8 be extended until the next regular municipal election provided for by
9 AS 14.14.170(b), as amended by sec. 4 of this Act.

10 * Sec. 11. Section 3(d), ch. 52, SLA 1963, is repealed.

11 * Sec. 12. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1975.
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
