6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to aid to families with dependent
7 children; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 47.25.320 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 Sec. 47.25.320. AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE. (a) The department shall
11 determine the amount of assistance for a dependent child and the
12 relative with whom the dependent child is living, with regard to the
13 resources and necessary expenditures of the family and the condition
14 existing in each case. Assistance is sufficient if, when added to all
15 other income and support available to the child, the child and relative
16 have reasonable subsistence compatible with decency and health. How-
17 ever, the amount of assistance may not exceed the following:

18 (1) dependent child living with nonneedy relative: for a
19 child under age 18 who is living in the home of a nonneedy relative,
20 \$150, plus an additional \$150 for the second child, and \$50 per child
21 for the third and each additional child, up to a maximum of \$520;

22 (2) dependent child living with parent:

23 (A) for a parent and one child under 13, a maximum of
24 \$250;

25 (B) for a parent and one child age 13 to 18, a maximum
26 of \$300;

27 (C) for each additional child under age 18, \$50 per
28 month per child, up to a maximum of \$520 per month.

29 (b) The monetary maximums in (a) of this section do not apply to

1 payments made under this program for the care of a dependent child in
2 a foster family home. The payment shall conform to foster care rates
3 as provided by the department.

4 (c) The department shall submit a report to the legislature not
5 later than the first day of March of each year regarding fiscal data
6 on the aid to families with dependent children program with special
7 reference to amount of funds required to maintain adequate payments in
8 consideration of changes in cost of living.

9 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect July 1, 1974.
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
