6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to compensation of justices, judges and
7 magistrates."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 22.05.140 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 22.05.140. COMPENSATION. (a) The chief justice and each
11 associate justice shall receive \$36,000 annually as compensation. The
12 compensation is payable monthly in 12 equal installments, or, at the
13 option of the justice, semi-monthly in 24 equal installments. Compensa-
14 tion of the chief justice or of an associate justice shall not be
15 diminished during his term of office, unless by general law applying
16 to all salaried officers of the state.

17 (b) No salary warrant may be issued to a justice of the supreme
18 court unless [UNTIL] he has filed with the state officer designated to
19 issue salary warrants within 30 days preceding the date of his monthly
20 installment or within 15 days preceding the date of his semi-monthly
21 installment, as appropriate, an affidavit that no matter referred to
22 the justice for opinion or decision has been uncompleted or undecided
23 by him for a period of more than six months.

24 * Sec. 2. AS 22.10.190 is amended to read:

25 Sec. 22.10.190. COMPENSATION. (a) Each superior court judge
26 shall receive \$33,000 annually, as compensation, payable monthly in 12
27 equal installments, or, at the option of the judge, semi-monthly in 24
28 equal installments. The compensation of a judge shall not be diminished
29 during his term of office, unless by general law applying to all

1 salaried officers of the state.

2 (b) No salary warrant may be issued to a superior court judge
3 unless [UNTIL] he has filed with the state officer designated to issue
4 salary warrants within 30 days preceding the date of his monthly install-
5 ment or within 15 days preceding the date of his semi-monthly installment,
6 as appropriate, an affidavit that no matter referred to the judge for
7 opinion or decision has been uncompleted or undecided by him for a
8 period of more than six months.

9 * Sec. 3. AS 22.15.220 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 22.15.220. COMPENSATION. (a) each district judge shall
11 receive \$27,500 annually as compensation, payable monthly in 12 equal
12 installments, or, at the option of the judge, semi-monthly in 24 equal
13 installments.

14 (b) Each magistrate shall receive annual compensation to be deter-
15 mined by the supreme court. Salary increases shall be determined on the
16 basis of percentage of pay increase the legislature provides for state
17 employees in the classified service. A magistrate's annual compensation
18 may be payable, at the option of the magistrate, either monthly in 12
19 equal installments or semi-monthly in 24 equal installments.

20 (c) No salary warrant may be issued to a district judge or mag-
21 istrate unless [UNTIL] he has filed with the state officer designated
22 to issue salary warrants, within 30 days preceding the date of his
23 monthly installment or within 15 days preceding the date of his semi-
24 monthly installment, as appropriate, an affidavit that no matter referred
25 to him for opinion or decision has been uncompleted or undecided by him
26 for a period of more than six months.
