6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to schools on military reservations;  
7 and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 14.12.020(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) Operation of the state-operated school district is under the  
11 management and control of the board of the state-operated schools. The  
12 board of the state-operated schools manages and controls schools on  
13 military reservations located within a city or an organized borough  
14 until the military mission is terminated or [AND] so long as management  
15 and control by the state-operated schools is approved by the Department  
16 of Education. However, operation of the military reservation schools  
17 by a city or borough school district may be required by the Department  
18 of Education under AS 14.14.110 [, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE CITY OR  
19 BOROUGH SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD]. If the military mission of a military  
20 reservation terminates or [AND] continued management and control by  
21 the state-operated schools is disapproved by the Department of Educa-  
22 tion, operation, management and control of schools on military reserva-  
23 tions transfers to the city or borough school district in which the  
24 military reservation is located.

25 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.12.030 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

26 (d) Each city or borough school district that is operating  
27 schools on a military reservation under sec. 20(a) of this chapter has  
28 one nonvoting delegate from the military reservation or reservations to  
29 the school district board to advise and assist the board in matters

1 relating to the military reservation schools operated by the school  
2 district and to act as liaison between the board and the advisory school  
3 board or boards established under AS 14.14.170(a). The nonvoting  
4 delegate shall be appointed by the state Board of Education, shall serve  
5 at its pleasure, and shall be an inhabitant of the area served by the  
6 military reservation schools operated by the school district by contract.

7 \* Sec. 3. AS 14.14.110 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

8 (c) A contract for the operation of schools on military reserva-  
9 tions by a city or borough school district under AS 14.12.020(a) and in  
10 (a) of this section shall include, in addition to the terms and condi-  
11 tions prescribed by the department under (b) of this section, provisions  
12 for the following:

13 (1) the educational program provided by the school district  
14 in the schools on the military reservation shall be comparable to the  
15 program provided by the school district in its nonmilitary reservation  
16 schools; and

17 (2) the school district shall be fully reimbursed for the  
18 cost of operation of the schools on a military reservation.

19 \* Sec. 4. AS 29.33.050 is amended to read:

20 Sec. 29.33.050. EDUCATION. Each borough constitutes a borough  
21 school district and establishes, maintains, and operates a system of  
22 public schools on an areawide basis as provided in AS 14.14.060. A  
23 military reservation within an organized borough is not part of the  
24 borough school district until the military mission is terminated or  
25 until inclusion in the borough school district is approved by the  
26 Department of Education. However, operation of the military reserva-  
27 tion schools by the borough school district may be required by the  
28 Department of Education under AS 14.14.110 [, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE  
29 BOROUGH SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD]. If the military mission of a military

1 reservation terminates and continued management and control by the  
2 state-operated schools is disapproved by the Department of Education,  
3 operation, management and control of schools on military reservations  
4 transfers to the borough school district in which the military reserva-  
5 tion is located.

6 \* Sec. 5. AS 29.41.010(a) is amended to read:

7 (a) A third class borough shall exercise the areawide powers of  
8 education and tax assessment and collection in the manner provided for  
9 second class boroughs. Provisions of law relative to first and second  
10 class organized boroughs apply with respect to third class boroughs only  
11 to the extent they are consistent with this chapter. A military reser-  
12 vation within an organized borough is not part of the borough school  
13 district until the military mission is terminated or until inclusion  
14 in the borough school district is approved by the Department of Educa-  
15 tion. However, operation of the military reservation schools by the  
16 borough school district may be required by the Department of Education  
17 under AS 14.14.110 [, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE BOROUGH SCHOOL DISTRICT  
18 BOARD]. If the military mission of a military reservation terminates  
19 and continued management and control by the state-operated schools is  
20 disapproved by the Department of Education, operation, management and  
21 control of schools on military reservations transfers to the borough  
22 school district in which the military reservation is located.

23 \* Sec. 6. Sec. 12, Chapter 72, SLA 1974 is repealed and reenacted to read:

24 Sec. 12. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with  
25 AS 01.10.070(c).
