6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to gravel removal for public construc-
7 tion; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 36 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

10 CHAPTER 30. GRAVEL REMOVAL.

11 Sec. 36.30.010. PERMIT TO REMOVE GRAVEL. A contractor or sub-
12 contractor who performs work on public construction in the state may
13 not remove gravel for use in the public construction project without a
14 permit from the political subdivision or agency of the state contract-
15 ing for the work.

16 Sec. 36.30.020. ISSUANCE OF PERMIT. (a) The contracting poli-
17 tical subdivision or agency of the state may not issue a permit for
18 gravel removal unless an engineer from the contracting political sub-
19 division or agency has inspected the site of the proposed gravel removal
20 and certified that the removal will not cause damage to adjacent land.

21 (b) A permit shall specify the amount of gravel permitted to be
22 removed and the boundaries of the permitted removal operations.

23 (c) As a condition of receiving a permit, a contractor or sub-
24 contractor shall agree not to stockpile materials on adjacent land
25 without the written consent of the owner of the adjacent land.

26 Sec. 36.30.030. PERIODIC INSPECTION. A political subdivision or
27 agency of the state, after issuing a permit for removal of gravel, shall
28 periodically inspect the site of the public construction to ensure that
29 the gravel removal has not caused damage to the adjacent land, the

1 removal has not exceeded the amount and boundaries of permitted removal,
2 and there has been no unauthorized stockpiling.

3 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1975.
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
