6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to employment practices and working
7 conditions; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 *Section 1. AS 23.10.060 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 Sec. 23.10.060. PAYMENT FOR OVERTIME. No employer who employs
11 employees engaged in commerce, or other business, or in the production
12 of goods or materials in Alaska may employ an employee, either male or
13 female, for a workweek longer than 40 hours or for more than eight hours
14 a day, except that if the employer finds it necessary to employ an
15 employee in excess of 40 hours a week or eight hours a day, compensation
16 for the overtime at the rate of one and one-half times the regular rate
17 of pay shall be paid, and this provision is considered included in all
18 contracts of employment. This section does not apply with respect to an
19 employee

20 (1) engaged in agriculture;

21 (2) employed in connection with the publication of a weekly,
22 semiweekly, or daily newspaper with a circulation of less than 1,000;

23 (3) of an employer engaged in the business of operating
24 taxicabs;

25 (4) in an otherwise exempted employment or proprietor in a
26 retail or service establishment engaged in handling telegraphic, tele-
27 phone, or radio messages for the public under an agency or contract
28 arrangement with a telegraph or communications company where the tele-
29 graph message or communications revenue of the agency does not exceed

1 \$500 a month;

2 (5) employed as a seaman.

3 * Sec. 2. AS 23.10.075 is amended to read:

4 Sec. 23.10.075. LABOR LAW COMPLIANCE [WAGE AND HOUR] DIVISION.

5 (a) There is in the department a labor law compliance [THE WAGE AND
6 HOUR] division, which is under a director, responsible to the commis-
7 sioner. The director shall administer secs. 50 - 150 of this chapter.

8 (b) The commissioner may appoint the director and the assistants
9 and other employees necessary for the proper enforcement of secs. 50 -
10 150 of this chapter and fix their compensation, subject to the provision
11 of law applicable to the appointment and compensation of state employees.

12 (c) The director may delegate his powers, functions and duties
13 under secs. 50 - 150 of this chapter to a duly authorized representative.

14 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
15 070(c).
