A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating the Mendenhall Flats State Game
7 Refuge; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 16.20.030 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

10 (c) Mendenhall Flats Refuge, consisting of state-owned lands
11 only, including tide and submerged lands, within the following descrip-
12 tion: Beginning at the north-south line common to Sections 33 and 34,
13 Township 40 South, Range 66 East, Copper River Meridian, at its inter-
14 section with the Glacier Highway; said point lying approximately 450
15 feet due west of Switzer Creek; thence south approximately 1.63 miles to
16 its intersection with the North Douglas Highway; thence trend northwest
17 along the center line of the North Douglas Highway approximately 3.8
18 miles to its intersection with the southwesterly boundary of Lot No. 5,
19 U. S. Survey 3281; thence N 49° 06' W along the southwest boundary of
20 Lot No. 5, U. S. Survey 3281, 316.8 feet to the true point for Meander
21 Corner No. 5 of the same; said point lying on the northwest shore of
22 Douglas Island at its intersection with the Gastineau Channel; thence
23 approximately N 23° 30' W, a distance of 1.6 miles to the southern
24 extension of the center line of the East Mendenhall Peninsula Road; said
25 point lying 33 feet S 82° 29' W from Corner No. 1, Lot 30, U. S. Survey
26 No. 2903; thence northwest and northeast along the center line of the
27 eastern access road to the Mendenhall Peninsula approximately 2.2 miles
28 to its intersection with the center line of the Glacier Highway; thence
29 trend southeasterly along the center line of the Glacier Highway

1 approximately 4.4 miles to its intersection with the north-south line
2 common to Sections 33 and 34, Township 40 South, Range 66 East, Copper
3 River Meridian, the point of beginning; said area containing 5,242
4 acres, more or less. Egress and ingress to and from private property
5 within the area described in this subsection shall be allowed through
6 access corridors established through agreement between the Department of
7 Natural Resources and the Department of Fish and Game, after consulta-
8 tion with the private property owners involved.

9 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
10 070(c).
