5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act providing for the issuance of general obliga-
7 tion bonds in the amount of \$30,050,000 for the purpose
8 of paying the cost of flood control, port facilities
9 development and small boat harbor projects, and making
10 related appropriations; and providing for an effective
11 date."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

13 * Section 1. For the purpose of paying the cost of flood control pro-
14 jects, port facilities development projects under AS 30.15 and small boat
15 harbor projects under AS 35.10.090 - 35.10.120, general obligation bonds of
16 the state in the principal amount of not more than \$30,050,000 shall be
17 issued and sold. The full faith, credit and resources of the state are
18 pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest and redemption
19 premium, if any, on these bonds. These bonds shall be issued under the
20 provisions of AS 37.15 as those provisions read at the time of issuance.

21 * Sec. 2. (a) If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the quali-
22 fied voters of the state, a special fund of the state to be known as the
23 "1976 Flood Control, Port Facilities Development and Small Boat Harbors Fund"
24 shall be established, to which shall be credited the proceeds of the sale of
25 the bonds described in sec. 1 of this Act except for the accrued interest and
26 premiums. There is appropriated from the "1976 Flood Control, Port Facili-
27 ties Development and Small Boat Harbors Fund" to the Department of Public
28 Works the amount of \$30,050,000.

29 (b) The specific uses of the proceeds of these bonds shall be as set

1 out in secs. 3 - 5 of this Act.

2 * Sec. 3. Department of Public Works for port facilities development
3 projects to be allocated in accordance with the Port Facilities Development
4 Act (AS 30.15), and for various small boat harbor projects to be allocated in
5 accordance with AS 35.10.090 - 35.10.120, apportioned, but not limited, to
6 the following projects and estimates notwithstanding the provisions of AS
7 24.30.037;

19 * Sec. 4. Department of Public Works for contingencies and cost overruns
20 applicable to port facilities development and small boat harbor projects
21 under AS 30.15 and AS 35.10.090 - 35.10.120, respectively, set out in sec. 3
22 of this Act, and for other port facilities development and small boat harbor
23 projects under AS 30.15 and AS 35.10.090 - 35.10.120 at the discretion of
24 the commissioner of public works, with the approval of the governor, not-
25 withstanding AS 24.30.037, \$1,500,000.

26 * Sec. 5. Department of Public Works for flood control projects in the
27 vicinity of Fairbanks, \$4,500,000.

28 * Sec. 6. If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified
29 voters of the state, the amount of \$105,200 or as much of that amount as is

1 found necessary is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
2 state bond committee to carry out the provisions of this Act and to pay
3 expenses incident to the sale and issuance of the bonds authorized in this
4 Act. The amounts expended from the appropriation authorized by this section
5 shall be reimbursed to the general fund from the proceeds of the sale of the
6 bonds authorized by this Act.

7 * Sec. 7. The question whether the bonds authorized in this Act are to be
8 issued shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the state at the next
9 general election and shall read substantially as follows:

10 Proposition

11 State General Obligation Flood Control, Port
12 Facilities Development and Small Boat Harbor
13 Projects Bonds \$30,050,000

14 Shall the State of Alaska issue its general obligation bonds
15 in the principal amount of not more than \$30,050,000 for the
16 purpose of paying the cost of flood control, port facilities
17 development and small boat harbor projects?
