6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to toilet facilities."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 \* Section 1. AS 18.35.100 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

9 Sec. 18.35.100. TOILET FACILITIES REQUIRED. (a) An owner of a  
10 restaurant or tavern in operation on the effective date of this Act  
11 shall provide and maintain on the premises no less than one sanitary  
12 toilet accommodation for public use, and shall comply with this require-  
13 ment within 180 days after the effective date of this Act.

14 (b) An owner of a restaurant or tavern shall provide and maintain  
15 on the premises sanitary toilet accommodations for public use.

16 \* Sec. 2. AS 18.35.120 is amended to read:

17 Sec. 18.35.120. ENFORCEMENT. The department shall promulgate  
18 regulations to implement and enforce sec. 100 of this chapter by appro-  
19 priate means. These regulations shall set standards of sanitation and  
20 shall provide for, but need not be limited to, periodic inspections.  
21 However, these regulations may not require a restaurant or tavern in  
22 operation on the effective date of this Act to have more than one toilet  
23 accommodation. A restaurant or tavern which is remodeled after the  
24 effective date of this Act is considered to be newly constructed  
25 [ , INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PERIODIC INSPECTIONS ].

27 (7) "remodeling" means any substantial modification of the  
28 physical structure or redesign and redecoration the value of which  
29 exceeds 10 per cent of the fair market value of the structure.

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
