5 Relating to a coastal zone management pro-
6 gram.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the coastal area of Alaska is rich in natural resources and aes-
9 thetic qualities; and

10 WHEREAS public and private demands on the coastal zone could endanger
11 these resources and aesthetic qualities; and

12 WHEREAS there already exists considerable statutory authority within
13 the several departments of the state to deal with coastal zone matters; and

14 WHEREAS this authority is often exercised in a diverse and conflicting
15 manner resulting in unrelated resource allocation within the coastal zone;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, in order to protect the coastal resources of the state, compre-
18 hensive legislation may be necessary;

19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the Legislative
20 Affairs Agency, in cooperation with the Office of the Governor, codify all
21 laws and regulations pertaining to coastal zone management for submission to
22 the First Session of the Tenth Legislature; and be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED that two members of the Senate and two members of the
24 House, as appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House,
25 meet with a like group appointed by the Governor to review all public testi-
26 mony submitted to the legislature and the administration on the subject of
27 Alaska coastal zone management to coordinate further public procedures as
28 considered necessary; and to coordinate activities leading to the development
29 of a sound coastal zone management program during the First Session of the

1 Tenth Legislature; and be it

2 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to submit to the First
3 Session of the Tenth Legislature a proposed program for coastal zone manage-
4 ment in general compliance with the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of
5 1972.
