6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to larceny of money or property."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 \* Section 1. AS 11.20.140 is amended to read:

9       Sec. 11.20.140. LARCENY OF MONEY OR PROPERTY. A person who  
10 steals money, goods, or chattels, or a government note, a bank note,  
11 promissory note, bill of exchange, bond, or other thing in action, or  
12 a book of accounts, order or certificate concerning money or goods due  
13 or to become due or to be delivered, or a deed or writing containing a  
14 conveyance of land or interest in land, or a bill of sale, or writing  
15 containing a conveyance of goods or chattels or interest in them, or  
16 any other valuable contract in force, or a receipt, release, or  
17 defeasance, or a writ, process, or public record, which is the property  
18 of another, is guilty of larceny. Upon conviction, if the property  
19 stolen exceeds \$250 [\$100] in value, a person guilty of larceny is  
20 punishable by imprisonment [IN THE PENITENTIARY] for not less than one  
21 nor more than 10 years. If the property stolen does not exceed \$250  
22 [\$100] in value, the person, upon conviction, is punishable by im-  
23 prisonment [IN A JAIL] for not less than one month nor more than one  
24 year, or by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100, or by  
25 both.
