6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the possession of weapons by  
7 convicts."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 11.55.030 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 11.55.030. POSSESSION BY CONVICTS. (a) A person who has  
11 been convicted of a crime involving violence or the use of a weapon  
12 [FELONY, OR A MISDEMEANOR INVOLVING ASSAULT AND BATTERY, ASSAULT WITH  
13 A DANGEROUS WEAPON, BURGLARY, ROBBERY AND LIKE CRIMES,] by a court in  
14 this [THE] state, or by the courts of the United States or of another  
15 state or territory, may not own or have in his possession or under his  
16 custody or control a pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of  
17 being concealed about his person, or carry concealed about his person  
18 a knife with a blade over two inches long or a dirk or dagger, sling-  
19 shot, metal knuckles, or an instrument commonly considered to be a  
20 weapon [BY THE USE OF WHICH INJURY COULD BE INFLICTED UPON THE PERSON  
21 OR PROPERTY OF ANOTHER].

22 (b) The provisions of (a) of this section do not apply to a person  
23 who has received a pardon for the prior conviction upon which this  
24 action is based or where that prior conviction occurred more than five  
25 years ago if it was a misdemeanor, or more than 10 years ago if it was  
26 a felony.

27 (c) For purposes of this section, a "crime involving violence"  
28 includes, but is not limited to, murder, manslaughter, rape, mayhem,  
29 robbery, kidnapping, burglary, or any felonious assault; but does not

1 include the misdemeanor of assault and battery.
