6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to minors on premises selling intoxicating beverages."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 04.15.020(d) is amended to read:

10 (d) Presence of minors on premises. It is unlawful for [TO PERMIT
11 a person under the age of 19 years to enter or remain upon licensed
12 premises unless he is accompanied by his parent, guardian or spouse who
13 has attained the age of 19 years. However, a person 18 years of age
14 or older may enter and remain upon licensed premises in the course of
15 his employment as a musician, entertainer or busboy. In addition, a
16 person under the age of 19 years may enter and remain upon licensed
17 premises which are also recognized as a restaurant for the purpose of
18 dining or dancing if accompanied by his parent or guardian or by the
19 parent or guardian of any other minor also present, or by any other adult
20 with the consent of the minor's parent or guardian. The Alcoholic
21 Beverage Control Board, with the approval of the city council if the
22 premises are within the city or with the approval of the borough assembly
23 if the premises are outside the city but within a borough, shall designate
24 which premises are restaurants for the purposes of this section.
25 Licensed premises are premises holding licenses under AS 04.10.020(a) -
26 04.10.020(d). The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board shall promulgate
27 regulations for the designation of restaurants and the continuation or
28 withdrawal of the designation. No establishment may be designated as a
29 restaurant for purposes of dining without the consent of the licensee.
