5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to intoxicating beverages."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 04.10.110 is amended to read:

9 Sec. 04.10.110. WHOLESALE LICENSE. (a) The holder of a general
10 wholesale license may sell intoxicating liquors in the original package
11 and wine in bulk, in quantities of not less than five wine gallons to
12 holders of licenses. The holder of a general wholesale license may not
13 sell to a consumer. Liquor requiring internal revenue strip stamps
14 shall have the stamps intact on the package. A general wholesale li-
15 cense shall be required for each distributing point. The general
16 wholesale license fee schedule is based upon the total amount of busi-
17 ness transacted during any year and is \$500 as a minimum license fee,
18 to accompany the application, and in payment of the fee for the first
19 \$50,000 of business transacted, and, in addition thereto, a sum equal
20 to one percent of the business transacted during the year for which
21 the license is issued. [ON THE BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING ANY YEAR,

5 (b) The holder of a wholesale malt beverage and wine license may
 6 sell malt beverages and wine in the original packages and malt beverages
 7 and wine in bulk in quantities of not less than five wine gallons to
 8 holders of licenses. The holder of a wholesale malt beverage and wine
 9 license may not sell to a consumer. The malt beverages and wine license
 10 fee schedule is based on the total amount of business transacted in any
 11 year and is \$100 as a minimum license fee, to accompany the application,
 12 and in payment of the fee for the first \$10,000 of business transacted,
 13 and, in addition, a sum equal to one per cent of the business transacted
 14 during the year for which the license is issued. [ON THE BUSINESS

25 * Sec. 2. AS 04.15.020(d) is amended to read:

26 (d) Presence of minors on premises. It is unlawful for [TO PERMIT]
 27 a person under the age of 19 years to enter or remain upon licensed
 28 premises unless he is accompanied by his parent, guardian or spouse who
 29 has attained the age of 19 years. However, a person 18 years of age or

1 older may enter and remain upon licensed premises in the course of his
2 employment as a musician, entertainer or busboy. In addition, a person
3 under the age of 19 years may enter and remain upon licensed premises
4 which are also recognized as a restaurant for the purpose of dining or
5 dancing if accompanied by his parent or guardian or by the parent or
6 guardian of any other minor also present, or by any other adult with the
7 consent of the minor's parent or guardian. The Alcoholic Beverage
8 Control Board, with the approval of the city council if the premises are
9 within the city or with the approval of the borough assembly if the
10 premises are outside the city but within a borough, shall designate which
11 premises are restaurants for the purposes of this section. Licensed
12 premises are premises holding licenses under AS 04.10.020(a) - 04.10.-
13 020(d). The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board shall promulgate regula-
14 tions for the designation of restaurants and the continuation or with-
15 drawal of the designation. No establishment may be designated as a
16 restaurant for purposes of dining without the consent of the licensee.
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
