6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to lay members on boards and commis-
7 sions."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 08.01 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 Sec. 08.01.015. QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS OF BOARDS AND COMMIS-
11 SIONS. At least one member of the following boards and commissions
12 shall be a layman who is not licensed or trained in the discipline for
13 which he is appointed to serve as a board or commission member:

- 14 (1) Board of Public Accountancy;
- 15 (2) Board of Barber Examiners;
- 16 (3) Board of Governors of Alaska Bar Association;
- 17 (4) Board of Chiropractic Examiners;
- 18 (5) Board of Hairdressing and Beauty Culture Examiners;
- 19 (6) Board of Dental Examiners;
- 20 (7) Board of Electrical Examiners;
- 21 (8) State Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers
22 and Land Surveyors;
- 23 (9) State Medical Board;
- 24 (10) Board of Nursing;
- 25 (11) Board of Examiners in Optometry;
- 26 (12) Board of Pharmacy;
- 27 (13) Real Estate Commission;
- 28 (14) Board of Veterinary Examiners;
- 29 (15) Board of Psychologist and Psychological Associate

1 Examiners;

- 2 (16) Collection Agency Board;
3 (17) Board of Welding Examiners;
4 (18) Board of Marine Pilots;
5 (19) Board of Dispensing Opticians;
6 (20) Teachers Retirement Board;
7 (21) Professional Teaching Practices Commission;
8 (22) Alaska King Crab Marketing Board.

9 * Sec. 2. For each board listed in AS 08.01.015 which has an even number
10 of members, the membership shall be increased by one who shall be a layman
11 appointed to the board for the term applicable to other members. For each
12 board which has an odd number of members:

13 (1) who are from the same discipline and are not selected from districts,
14 the number of persons required to be from the discipline is decreased by one
15 and at the next vacancy for a full term a layman shall be appointed;

16 (2) who are from the same discipline and are selected partly at large
17 and partly from districts, the number of persons serving at large from the
18 discipline is decreased by one, and at the next vacancy for a full term at
19 large a layman shall be appointed;

20 (3) who are from one discipline and all of the members are selected
21 from districts or from more than one discipline or from more than one recog-
22 nized branch of a discipline or has members who serve by virtue of holding
23 another position with the state or federal government, the number of members
24 shall be increased by two laymen, one of whom shall be appointed for a full
25 term as prescribed for other members and one of whom shall be appointed for a
26 term one year less than a full term.
