5 Relating to the study of alternative oil
6 and gas leasing and taxing policies.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS revenue needs of the state to provide necessary and desirable
9 public services have been increasing and are anticipated to continue to
10 increase; and

11 WHEREAS revenue from oil and gas leases and production of oil and gas in
12 the state is viewed as a means of meeting the major revenue needs of the
13 state; and

14 WHEREAS there has been divergent testimony before the legislature on the
15 effect of increased taxation of oil and gas leases and production on future
16 oil and gas development in the state; and

17 WHEREAS testimony by the legislature's oil and gas consultants includes
18 a recommendation that existing leasing and taxing policies as well as con-
19 templated changes should be carefully reviewed together to accurately deter-
20 mine their long-range impact and accrued advantage or disadvantage to the
21 state;

22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the Legislative
23 Council is requested to undertake in cooperation with the Governor a compre-
24 hensive and definite study resulting in recommendations for a long-term oil
25 and gas leasing and taxation policy, and that the conclusions and recommenda-
26 tions of the study be presented to the legislature within 14 days of the
27 convening of the First Session of the Tenth Legislature.

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
