3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 NINTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to certain practices of the

6 United States Veterans Administration.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS the Veterans Administration requires prescriptions even for
9 routine medications; and

10 WHEREAS it is the policy of the Veterans Administration to require
11 that medication for persons eligible to receive free medication be furnished
12 from the nearest Veterans Administration pharmacy; and

13 WHEREAS, because of this policy, many Alaskans are required to order
14 even non-prescription items from Seattle; and

15 WHEREAS that requirement is time consuming, and, in addition, there is
16 the chance of a person not receiving his medication by the time his present
17 supply is exhausted, and there is always a risk that the medication will be
18 damaged during the shipping process; and

19 WHEREAS it would seem only logical that at least for what would be
20 ordinary non-prescription medications the Veterans Administration permit
21 persons to purchase these items at local pharmacies; and

22 WHEREAS, if the latter policy were instituted, it would benefit the
23 patient as well as lessen the flow of paper for the Administration;

24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the United States
25 Veterans Administration is urgently requested to change its policy of not
26 permitting persons requiring prescription and non-prescription medications
27 to obtain such medications at local pharmacies in their place of residence.
