6 For an Act entitled: "An Act exempting practitioners of medicine, osteopathy,
7 and psychology from certain requirements of the finan-
8 cial disclosure laws; and providing for an effective
9 date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. AS 39.50.200(8) is amended to read:

12 (8) "source of income" means the entity for which service is per-
13 formed or which is otherwise the origin of payment; if the person whose
14 income is being reported is employed by another, his employer is the
15 source of his income; but if he is self-employed by means of a sole
16 proprietorship, partnership, professional corporation, or a corporation
17 in which he or his spouse or his children, or a combination of them,
18 hold a controlling interest, the "source" is the client or customer of
19 the proprietorship, partnership or corporation, but if the entity which
20 is the origin of payment is not the same as the client or customer for
21 whom the service is performed, both are considered the source; "source
22 of income" does not include payments earned by a practitioner of medi-
23 cine, osteopathy, or psychology whose income which is being reported is
24 received from or paid on behalf of individual patients receiving profes-
25 sional medical, osteopathic, or psychological services;

26 * Sec. 2. This Act is retroactive to January 1, 1977, and reports required
27 to be filed under this chapter after that date do not need to contain infor-
28 mation exempted by sec. 1 of this Act.

29 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
