6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to state employment benefits, records,
7 and personnel rules."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 39.20.260 is amended by adding a new subsection to
10 read:

11 (h) Upon the death of a state employee who is not a member of a
12 collective bargaining unit, any unused medical leave balance will be
13 paid at the employee's current rate of pay according to the provisions
14 of sec. 360 of this chapter.

15 * Sec. 2. AS 39.20.330 is amended to read:

16 Sec. 39.20.330. DEPARTMENTS TO KEEP LEAVE RECORDS. Each depart-
17 ment, office, institution, or agency of the state government shall
18 keep for its files a complete annual and sick leave record, covering
19 each of its employees, on forms prepared and supplied by the Depart-
20 ment of Administration. These records are subject to [ANNUAL] audit
21 and approval by the state internal auditor [DIRECTOR OF PERSONNEL] of
22 the Department of Administration.

23 * Sec. 3. AS 39.25.150(23) is amended to read:

24 (23) the granting of employment preference rights to a
25 veteran at each time he applies for employment, not within the area of
26 promotion, when he possesses the necessary qualifications in the job
27 classification for which he applies under this chapter; the term
28 "veteran" means a person with 90 days or more active service in the
29 armed forces of the United States who has been honorably discharged

1 after having served during any period between April 6, 1917, and
2 December 1, 1919, between September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1947,
3 [OR] between June 27, 1950, and January 31, 1955, or between August 14,
4 1964, and May 7, 1975 [A DATE TO BE DETERMINED BY THE LEGISLATURE
5 WHICH SHALL BE ON OR ABOUT SIX MONTHS AFTER THE TERMINATION OF HOS-
6 TILITIES INVOLVING FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES IN VIET NAM]; the term
7 "disabled veteran" means a veteran who is rated by the United States
8 Veterans' Administration as having at least a 10 per cent service-
9 connected disability; in the examination to determine the qualification
10 of applicants for entrance into the classified service under merit
11 system examination, five additional points shall be added to the
12 passing grade of a veteran and 10 additional points shall be added to
13 the passing grade of a disabled veteran; if a position in the classified
14 service is eliminated, employees shall be released in accordance with
15 rules which give due effect to all factors; if all job qualifications
16 are equal, the veteran shall be given preference over the nonveteran
17 and the veteran shall be kept on the job.
