5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act providing for the issuance of general obliga-
7 tion bonds in the amount of \$48,841,900 for the purpose
8 of paying the cost of capital improvements for con-
9 structing, repairing, equipping, and upgrading school
10 facilities; and providing for an effective date."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

12 * Section 1. For the purpose of paying the cost of capital improvements
13 for constructing, repairing, equipping, and upgrading school facilities,
14 general obligation bonds of the state in the principal amount of not more
15 than \$48,841,900 shall be issued and sold. The full faith, credit and re-
16 sources of the state are pledged to the payment of the principal of and
17 interest and redemption premium, if any, on these bonds. These bonds shall
18 be issued under the provisions of AS 37.15 as those provisions read at the
19 time of issuance.

20 * Sec. 2. If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified
21 voters of the state, a special fund of the state to be known as the "1978
22 School Construction Fund" shall be established, to which shall be credited
23 the proceeds of the sale of the bonds described in sec. 1 of this Act except
24 for the accrued interest and premiums. The amount of \$48,841,900 is appro-
25 priated from the "1978 School Construction Fund" to the Department of Trans-
26 portation and Public Facilities. The proceeds of these bonds shall be allo-
27 cated as follows:

28 (1) To repair and bring into compliance with fire and \$ 8,000,000
29 safety codes the following schools:

1 Koyuk, Shishmaref, Teller, Unalakleet, Wales,
2 White Mountain, Alakanuk, Emmonak, Hooper Bay,
3 Marshall (Fortuna Ledge), Mountain Village,
4 Pitkas Point, Russian Mission, Atmoutluak,
5 Bethel, Kongiginak, Platinum, Toksook Bay,
6 Allakaket, Hughes, Huslia, Tanana

7 (2) To repair and bring into compliance with fire and
8 safety codes and to address major maintenance needs which the
9 Department of Education determines are most in need of work: \$10,000,000

10 (3) To provide oil storage facilities at rural schools
11 determined by the Department of Education: \$ 2,000,000

12 (4) To provide new school facilities in the following
13 regional educational attendance areas and communities: \$28,841,900

15 Noatak \$ 743,000

16 (B) Bering Strait REAA
