5 Honoring Keith Specking.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

7 WHEREAS Keith Specking has resigned from the legislature to accept
8 appointment by the governor as special consultant to the Department of Fish
9 and Game; and

10 WHEREAS Representative Specking's untiring and devoted service to the
11 State of Alaska as a member of the House of Representatives since January
12 1971 has produced an admirable record of legislation in the best interest of
13 the state; and

14 WHEREAS Keith has been the driving force behind legislation to improve
15 the game and guiding laws, provide safety standards for oil tankers, and
16 provide for orderly and rational development of the state's natural resources
17 particularly oil and gas; and

18 WHEREAS, in addition to initiating legislation in key areas, Keith is
19 well known for his stabilizing and moderating influence during times of
20 stress and conflict; and

21 WHEREAS, in recognition of his legislative accomplishments and leader-
22 ship ability, Keith was chosen to be House minority leader for both sessions
23 of the Ninth Legislature; and

24 WHEREAS, in further recognition of his legislative background, sound
25 judgment and natural resource expertise, Keith serves as the House member on
26 the Commission on the Conference on the Law of the Sea, as an advisor to the
27 North Pacific Fisheries Management Council, an advisor to the International
28 North Pacific Fishery Commission, and as a member of the Alaska Fisheries
29 Council; and

1 WHEREAS Alaska has been most fortunate to have a public servant of
2 Keith's caliber working in its behalf;

3 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature recognizes the many
4 accomplishments and contributions of Keith Specking, and wishes to honor him
5 by expressing its sincere appreciation for his legislative work to make
6 Alaska a better state; and be it

7 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature offers its best wishes to Keith
8 for every continued success in his new position.
