2 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 63

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 TENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Requesting that the branches of the armed
6 forces in Alaska adhere to a policy of
7 local in-state preference hire on contracts
8 for teaching GED classes.

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 WHEREAS a policy of utilizing in-state educational services and facili-
11 ties on contracts to teach GED at military bases will benefit both the state
12 and federal government; and

13 WHEREAS mutual economic benefit, as well as improved federal-state
14 relations provide sufficient reason for state local hire preferences for in-
15 state institutions on future GED contracts;

16 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urgently requests the
17 United States Congress to amend the applicable federal service contract and
18 procurement statutes and regulations so that a preference is granted for in-
19 state teachers to be employed on GED contracts on United States military
20 bases in all states.

28 Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in
29 Congress.
