5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act reinstating legislative compensation to its
7 status before ch. 205, SLA 1975; providing
8 for legislative per diem; repealing the Alaska Salary
9 Commission; and providing for an effective date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. AS 24.15.020 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

12 Sec. 24.15.020. ANNUAL LEGISLATIVE SALARIES. The annual salary
13 for each member of the legislature is \$9,000 to be paid in approximately
14 equal monthly payments. The president of the senate and the speaker of
15 the house of representatives are each entitled to an additional \$500 a
16 year during tenure of office.

17 * Sec. 2. AS 24.15.030 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

18 Sec. 24.15.030. ADDITIONAL ALLOWANCES. In addition, each member
19 of the legislature is entitled to an annual allowance of \$4,000 for
20 postage, stationery, stenographic services and other expenses.

21 * Sec. 3. AS 24.15.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

22 Sec. 24.15.010. LEGISLATIVE PER DIEM. For each day of the legis-
23 lative session and for each day on official legislative business between
24 sessions, legislators (1) on travel status and away from home overnight
25 shall be allowed, instead of their actual expenses for subsistence, the
26 per diem allowance prescribed by the commissioner of administration
27 under AS 39.20.160 for officials and employees of state agencies; and
28 (2) not away from home overnight shall receive an allowance of \$35 for
29 each day. The per diem allowance is also payable for each day of

1 necessary travel.

2 * Sec. 4. AS 39.23 is repealed.

3 * Sec. 5. This Act is retroactive to January 10, 1977.

4 * Sec. 6. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
5 070(c).
